Development of the three new parks was paid for out of budget funds rather than bond funds. The Park Commission takes pride in the fact that these parks were developed on a pay-as-you-go basis.

ADDED RECREATION FACILITIES

Picnicking, camping, and hiking areas, ballfields, shuffleboard and horeshoe courts, and children's playgrounds completed in 1961 brought a dividend in pleasure from the Bergen

County park investment.

Special attention was given the senior citizens. The County Park Commission installed shuffleboard courts in two parks and horseshoe courts in four parks, and two shelters were erected. Van Saun County Park in Paramus and River Edge acquired a senior center, with benches and picnic tables as well as a shelter and shuffleboard and horseshoe courts. Plans call for adding more facilities for Bergen's senior citizens.

Added recreation facilities made 1961 a year of fulfillment as well as a year of promise. As the Bergen County Park Commission reached the age of 15, it was endeavoring to strike a nice balance between providing current recreation areas and

building for the future.

The days of land reclamation and site acquisition are not yet behind us. But the park network is shaping up. It extends from the southernmost portion, North Arlington, to the Northwest, Mahwah, and Northeast, Rockleigh. In the center of the County is the park offering the widest selection of activities, Van Saun Park in Paramus.

CREWS KEPT BUSY

Bergen County Park Commission crews worked all year, draining off wet lands, rerouting streams, digging lakes, con-

structing roads and paths and parking areas, planting trees and shrubs and grass, putting in ballfields, building shuffleboard and horseshoe courts — also picnic tables and fireplaces and benches, erecting shelters and refreshment stands, fashioning park signs and log play equipment, labeling nature trails, piping drinking water—and maintaining and patrolling the whole park system. The crews also erected a model fallout shelter at Van Saun Park in co-operation with the Bergen County Division of Civil Defense and Disaster Control.

QUITE A TURNOUT

A record total of some 850,000 County-park visits in 1961 topped by about 30 per cent the 1960 total, which had set a

new high.

Revenue from the Rockleigh Bergen County Golf Course in 1961 reached \$121,945.66. There were 7,907 identification registrations in 1961, 522 annual family memberships, and 10 high school team memberships. Other income included greens fees, equipment rentals, lesson fees, pro shop proceeds, and refectory rental.

At the newer Bergen County Tennis Center in Van Saun Park the 1961 season's revenue totaled \$3,807.74. There were 1,283 identification registrations, 14 annual family memberships, and five high school team memberships. The Center

had its first full season of operation in 1961.

Poor week-end weather affected use of both the golf

course and the tennis center.

In addition to golf and tennis, County park activities include: baseball, camping, children's fishing, duck-feeding, football, hiking, horseshoe-pitching, ice-skating, model-airplane flying, model-boat sailing, picnicking, riding, shuffleboard, sledding, and soccer.

Also in the County parks are a children's zoo, miniature

steam railroad, rose garden, and nature preserve.




BERGEN COUNTY PARK SYSTEM
