Remarks: *Culiseta melanura* populations have been consistently low for the entire month of June at the sites where we have long term data on population levels. Centerton remains the only exception this year and is the only area we are monitoring with the potential for amplifying EEE virus in local bird populations. The month of July is normally a period when *Cs. melanura* populations decline steadily until the second generation of the season emerges in late July or early August. Considering this season's low spring population levels, *Cs. melanura* may not be able to recover until the transmission season is all but over. The totals for WNV surveillance have not changed since the last report because of data access problems in the system.
