

Hunterdon County 4-H Ambassadors



The 4-H Ambassadors are outstanding 4-H teens entering grades 10th, 11th, and 12th (current year) that speak at meetings of local organizations and schools, present ribbons and awards, emcee the 4-H Achievement Night and represent 4-H at a number of county and Board of Agriculture events. The position requires strong public speaking skills, the ability to communicate with people, enthusiasm for 4-H and the desire to share that enthusiasm with others.

The contest rules are as follows:

- 1. Contestant must be *entering grades 10, 11, 12* of the current year.
- 2. Contestant must be in the county during the year in which they are serving as a **4-H Ambassador.**
- 3. Each contestant is required to submit summary sheets for two years (current year complete to date entries due, plus past), a 4-H Ambassador Application Form in which the contestant tells in approximately 100 words why he or she would like to be a 4-H Ambassador and leader recommendation.
- 4. Applicants must be present for an interview in August.
- 5. Contestants will be judged by interview on the following:

a.	4-H Records	35%
b.	Personality, general	
	appearance and appropriate	
	dress.	20%
c.	Interview:	
	1. Ability to speak well	20%
	2. Quality of answers to	
	questions	15%
	3. Sincerity	<u>10%</u>
